Question 1:

Are some people's jobs in the church more important than others? Why not?

Answer:

Some people may have jobs that might make them more front-and-center like preaching, teaching or leading worship, but no job is more important than another.

God gives us all jobs that are needed and are used to serve the church. Just like the different colors of the rainbow, and how one color is not better than the other, when we are united together, we all glorify God. Each job is a way to love others and love God.



How do we, as Christians, serve people differently than those who are not Christians?

Answer:

Any person, believers or unbelievers, can serve other people and help others. But when believers serve, we want to help others and point them to Jesus.

Serving and meeting people's needs is a way to show God's love, but we also want to speak the truth of the gospel as well.

Game 1:

WHAT'S MISSING?

1. Tell kids that you are going to describe several activities and they must determine what is missing.

For example, to wash dishes you need dirty dishes, a sponge, and dish soap. Then ask, "What's missing?" Kids would respond by saying "water." Consider using the examples below or create your own:

- "To make a peanut butter and jelly sandwich you need peanut butter and jelly. What's missing?" (bread)
- "To brush your teeth you need a toothbrush and water. What's missing?" (toothpaste)
- "To grow a plant you need a seed, dirt, and water. What's missing?" (sunshine)

Game 1:

BIBLE CONNECTION

These activities need every part so they can be completed.

Today, we learned how some people in the early church saw that something was missing. We learned that some widows were not getting what they needed.

Instead of being silent about it and letting the widows suffer, they spoke up about it with the goal to solve the problem together because they loved Jesus.

Do you practice speaking up with loving words instead of harsh words?



FOUR CORNERS

- 1. Label each corner of the room with a number one through four.
- 2. Ask for one kid to volunteer to be in the middle of the room, close her eyes, and count to 10. While she does this, direct the other kids to quietly move around the room and select a corner to stand in.
- 3. When the 10 seconds are up, direct the kid in the middle to call out a corner number. Ask the kids standing in this corner to sit down. If no one is in the corner that is called, all kids can continue playing as a new volunteer is chosen to count to 10.

Game 2:

BIBLE CONNECTION

For this game, two choices needed to be made: a numbered corner had to be called out and kids had to choose what corner to stand in.

Today, we heard a story about the early church and how they needed to make a choice to find a solution to a problem they faced.
