# Read Mark 11: 7-10

Try to remember Pastor Derek's sermon.
What did he say is the proof that Jesus loves you and He wants to enter your heart?

## **Answer:**

Mark 8:31 says "Then Jesus began to tell them that the Son of Man must suffer many terrible things and be rejected by the elders, the leading priests, and the teachers of religious law. He would be killed, but three days later he would rise from the dead."

This teaches us that Jesus knew how He was going to die before He entered Jerusalem, riding on a donkey. Even though He knew the bad things that were going to happen to Him, He did not run away and chose to enter Jerusalem. Only someone who has a BIG LOVE for the people can lay down their life for someone else. Jesus loves you!



What would be different if Jesus stayed dead in the tomb? Why is it important that Jesus came back to life?

## **Answer:**

1 Corinthians 15:14 says, "And if Christ has not been raised, then all our preaching is useless, and your faith is useless."

- If Jesus stayed dead, that means that He wasn't the real "God", just another human being.
- If Jesus stayed dead, that means we will not be given eternal life even if we call upon the name of Jesus.

Jesus, coming back to life, proves to us that He is indeed the Son of God, and that He can give us eternal life when we believe in Him!



## Game Day

## **GET LOW**

- 1. Play a game of limbo using a long pole or a broomstick.
- 2. Play some music and direct kids to form a single file line.
- Lead kids to go under the pole, lowering it several inches after all the kids have gone under.
- 4. Tell kids that they must go under the pole with their head back and without falling to their knees.
- Repeat sending kids under the pole and lowering it until only one kid remains.

## Game 1:

#### **BIBLE CONNECTION**

Toward the end of this game you had to get very low to go under the pole. You couldn't win the game by raising your self higher. Only lowering yourself would help you win.

This reminds me of Jesus who chose to lower Himself to rescue us from sin. Even though He is God, He became a man to die on the cross.



## **UPSIDE DOWN**

- 1. Before the session, scatter 15–20 cups around the room right side up.
- 2. Form kids into two teams. Explain that teams will compete to see who can turn all the cups upside down the fastest.
- 3. On your start, direct the first team to begin flipping the cups upside down. Use a stopwatch or timer to time them.
- 4. Record their time once all the cups have been flipped upside down.
- 5. Then turn the cups right side up and begin again with team two.

## Game 2:

#### **BIBLE CONNECTION**

The kingdom of God looks upside down from the ways of the world. When the world tells us to put yourself first and live for your own desires, God's way teaches us to put others first and live for Jesus.

Today, we remembered Jesus' life and death. Jesus showed to us what it means to be humble when He followed God's plan to die for our sins. He put us above His own interests so that we could be saved from our sins.



## **OTHERS-FOCUSED**

- 1. Form kids into groups of three or four and give each group a piece of paper and a pencil.
- 2. Ask groups to write down three ways they can be others-focused toward people they know at their school, home, or community.

For example, kids may write choosing to let their friend play a video game first or offering to clean up their sibling's room.

3. Allow a few minutes for groups to write down their examples. Then allow groups to share their ideas.



## Game 3:

#### **BIBLE CONNECTION**

We're naturally drawn to serve ourselves. Yet, Jesus always put others first. Ultimately, Jesus showed us what it means to put others first by laying down His life and suffering for our sins on the cross.



He was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.
