What made Saul change?

Answer:

Game 1:

RUN FROM SAUL

- 1. Invite one kid to be Saul. Lead Saul to stand in the center of the room.
- 2. Tell the kids that Saul will count to 10 and while he does, they need to move to one of the four corners of the room.
- 3. Explain that Saul will keep his eyes closed and point to one of the four corners.
- 4. Tell kids that kids in that corner are out.
- 5. Play as time allows, choosing new kids to be Saul.

Game 1:

BIBLE CONNECTION

Today, we learned about a man named Saul. You might know him by his Roman name Paul.

Before Saul became a Christian, he wanted to put an end to the church. He went into believer's homes, dragged them out, and put them in jail. Many believers had to flee Jerusalem.

But even to a sinner like him, Jesus appeared. Jesus can rescue any of us while we are still sinners!

Game 2:

WHO ARE YOU?

- 1. Lead kids to sit in a circle. Tell kids to close their eyes.
- 2. Choose one kid to volunteer to say a phrase aloud such as "Pigs can't fly."
- 3. Remind the other kids to keep their eyes closed and listen carefully to the voice speaking.
- 4. Invite kids to open their eyes and point to who they think spoke.
- 5. Reveal the speaker and continue playing as time allows, changing the phrase as desired.

Game 2:

BIBLE CONNECTION

When you heard the person speaking, your eyes were closed. You had to identify the voice without seeing their face.

This reminds me of today's Bible story. On the road to Damascus, Saul heard a voice and asked, 'Who are you?' Even the men with him heard the voice too, but saw no one.

Even though Saul was hurting Jesus and His church, Jesus sought Saul out—like a Shepherd who searches for a lost sheep. Jesus had a plan for Saul's life and in His grace, He saved Saul.
